Understanding the needs of babies and young children with SEND (Cohort 5)

Level 2 - 'Every practitioner a SEND practitioner'

Southampton Early Years Advisory Teachers are pleased to offer a fifth cohort of this exciting, accredited training opportunity for practitioners in PVI settings and childminders working with children under 5.

The aim of this training is to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding of Early Years practitioners to ensure that they are capable and confident to effectively support the children and families they work with. A range of professionals and agencies will deliver information throughout the programme, to allow practitioners to have a thorough understanding of how to support children with SEND.

Why attend?

The course will culminate in receiving a level 2 CACHE endorsed unit, alongside knowledge of SEND and best practice gained along the way.

What will it cover?

Delegates will complete module-based assessments, all of which is explained to delegates during their first day.

What does it involve?

The course will require 100% commitment from attendees with full support from their manager. The training is carried out over 9 x 2 hour sessions. The sessions are delivered weekly – the first session is in person, at Start Point Sholing, followed by virtual sessions over Teams. The study sessions are completed independently with an Area SENDCo available to support over Teams if required.

What does it cost?

£50 non- refundable deposit and the rest will be funded by the LA £250 will need to be paid if the delegate does not complete the course to cover assessor fees

How to apply

Delegates need at least level 2 qualification and have experience of working with children or be new to the role of practitioner working with children, to support the reflective element of the sessions.

An ever changing playing field! MEETING THE NEEDS OF YOUR NEW COHORT

Year R/Year 1

- Are you dealing with a new class with a different set of needs?
- Do you struggle not having enough adults in the class?
- Do you have an increase in the number of children with identified and emerging SEND?
- Would you like support in how to best meet the needs of every child?

Every child is entitled to a high-quality education that Promotes high standards, meets their needs and supports them to achieve their best possible outcomes. This can be difficult due to children having low development outcomes on entry and higher levels of SEND.

The curriculum, pedagogy and teaching should be adaptive and respond to the needs of your children. How do you promote an inclusive environment, have high expectations for every child, find different ways to engage with children and change approaches or remove barriers to their learning and development? This training can help you find solutions to these questions.

Training outcomes:

- How to best identify the needs of the cohort.
- Consider how you meet children where they are at rather than where they should be.
- Consider how your universal provision may need to change to meet these needs.
- Consider whether your environment is supportive of the needs of your cohort.
- Consider how to ensure you offer progression in your curriculum from children's starting points.

'Numbers in Everyday Life' is a University of Southampton programme of activities that support families to recognise the everyday environment as a learning resource, and use family routines (e.g., weekly shopping, daily school run) as opportunities for drawing children's attention on numerals on everyday objects and talking about numbers.

It involves a sequence of fun **number spotting games** for families of 3–5-year-old children, included in resources that come in the form of Family Activity Postcards. The resources are free for Early Years providers who wish to become partners in this project.

The programme enables Early Years educators and families to make meaningful connections between children's experiences with numerals in everyday contexts, and their learning about numbers at preschool or school.



In this information event, Charis Voutsina (University of Southampton) will talk about the principles that underpin the design of the programme and what participation in this project involves for Early Years providers.

Natasha Li (Senior Manager & Managing Partner, St James Nursery & Preschool, Southampton) will share her experiences from a recent implementation of the programme at St James Nursery & Preschool.

GETTING EMOTIONAL?

Helping small children deal with big feelings. Promoting PSED in Year R

- Do your children struggle with their personal, social and emotional development?
- > Are you able to effectively support them in your year R classroom?
- Would you like to unpick the ELGs and explore how to better support children in this area?

Personal, social and emotional development (PSED) is crucial for children to lead healthy and happy lives and is fundamental to their cognitive development. Covid had a significant impact on the PSE skills of children and many children are entering year R with difficulties in this area. Profile scores in this area are decreasing as a result.

This course will allow you to look at how support children in their PSE development and ensure your practice and provision promotes emotional regulation, positive interactions and developing a sense of self.

This training will focus on:

We will explore the importance of children's emotional and social wellbeing. It will provide an opportunity to consider how provision can successfully nurture and support children.

Supporting young children with emerging characteristics of ADHD.

- Do you have children in your setting presenting with characteristics of ADHD?
