For some time the Government has been considering the future funding arrangements for council housing at a national level. Formal consultation on possible options took place during 2009 and due to overwhelming support nationally for one option it is understood that the Government will make and offer to Council's in Spring 2010 to be able to buy themselves out of the Housing Subsidy system. The Council's subsidy payment to the

Government for 2010/11 is £8.5 million.

Council delegated this item to the Executive Director for Resources dependant on the consultation response period. However given the allotted time period, Cabinet will be able to respond.
