3.	On 3 October 2018 the Care Quality Commission (CQC) published their comprehensive report into Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust. A summary of the key findings from the inspection, as well as an update on a number of important developments at Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust is attached as Appendix 1.		
4.	In November 2018 the HOSP were informed of a decision made by Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust to temporarily close Beaulieu Ward at Western Community Hospital, for up to six months, due to the Trust being unable to recruit the registered nurses needed to ensure Beaulieu Ward is a safe place for our patients and staff. Patient safety and the health and wellbeing of our		

	staff are always our priority and we feel there is no alternative option at this current time.
