Estate Regeneration Programme

Details

Report of the Head of Estate Regeneration seeking approval to exercise the delegation to purchase a small car dealership and flat in Northam Road with grant funding from PUSH.

The Estate Regeneration Programme was approved by Cabinet on 24th November 2008 to commence a programme of consultation and engagement with residents and stakeholders on the sites selected of underused shopping parades and associated flats, in order to identify a programme of sites for redevelopment. These projects, whilst providing important estate regeneration benefits, would also be part of wider more comprehensive change.

This report seeks authority to acquire, where terms can be agreed, parcels of land which it would be desirable to incorporate within the potential regeneration sites now where Cabinet has given approval for consultation with residents to ensure these opportunities are not missed. These properties will be let out on a short term basis providing the council with a fairly modest rental income pending site redevelopment.

Response to the "Buy Out" Offer for Reform of Council Housing Finance

Details

Report of the Head of Finance requesting approval to exercise the delegation to approve the Council's response to the Government's "buy-out" offer for Reform of Council Housing Finance if the response is required in such a period that it is not possible to submit a report to Council.

For some time the Government has been considering the future funding arrangements for council housing at a national level. Formal consultation on possible options took place during 2009 and due to overwhelming support nationally for one option it is understood that the Government will make and offer to Council's in Spring 2010 to be able to buy themselves out of the Housing Subsidy system. The Council's subsidy payment to the Government for 2010/11 is £8.5 million.

The timing of this decision is dependent on when the Council is advised on the buy out offer from the Government, and the subsequent timetable for response to this offer.
