REASONS FOR THE DECISION

A citywide Designated Public Places Order as amended above would:-

- (i) allow for the proper management of displacement;
- (ii) send a clear message that anti-social drinking in all public places is not acceptable and will not be tolerated;
- (iii) respond to requests from other areas of the city seeking inclusion in the Designated Public Places Order;
- (iv) contribute to meeting strategic priorities identified in the Community Safety Strategy 2005-2008 to reduce fear of crime and reduce alcohol-related crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.
