### 4. <u>APPLICATION FOR AMUSEMENTS WITH PRIZES PERMIT – CASH-IN</u> <u>AMUSEMENTS, 394 BITTERNE ROAD</u>

The Sub-Committee considered the report of the Solicitor to the Council, to determine an application for the grant of an amusements with prizes permit under section 34 (5E) of the Gaming Act 1968 in respect of Cash-In Amusements, 394 Bitterne Road.
