## 24. <u>APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF A SEX SHOP LICENCE – HIDDEN DESIRES, 103 ST. MARY STREET</u>

#### REASON FOR THE DECISION

Having regard to the Home Office Guidelines the Sub-Committee was satisfied that the applicant was not a fit and proper person in accordance with Section 51(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 to hold a Private Hire Driver's licence. That in view of the short space of time that had elapsed since the applicant's convictions and caution together with the nature and combination of the offences warranted a departure from the Home Office guidelines.
