### OPENING OF A RESOURCE PROVISION FOR CHILDREN WITH MODERATE LEARNING DIFFICUTIES AND AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER AT CANTELL SCHOOL

The following proposals are published under Section 31(1) of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 as amended by Section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 and the School Organisation (Making Significant Changes (Prescribed Alterations) to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013 and statutory guidance (2024).

NOTICE is hereby given that Southampton City Council ("the Council") intends to make prescribed alterations to:-

**Cantell School**, Violet Rd, Southampton SO16 3GJ

by establishing a SEN provision for children with Moderate Learning Difficulties and Autism Spectrum Disorder, at the school from 4<sup>th</sup> April 2025.

Southampton City Council is proposing to establish a resource provision for children with Moderate Learning Difficulties and Autism Spectrum Disorder at the school in response to an increase in demand for such a provision. The intention is to accommodate up to 10 pupils.
