### **Brief Service Profile (including number of customers)**

As the Local Planning Authority, Southampton City Council has a statutory duty to prepare a Local Development Scheme (LDS) under the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

The LDS is a project plan that sets out the Council's timetable for producing and reviewing its planning policy documents (known as Development Plan Documents, or DPDs), which include documents such as the Local Plan. The LDS must outline any planning policy documents the Council intends to produce and the timescales for doing so in order for progress to be monitored.

The Council's last LDS was compiled November 2022 and is now considered to be out of date. Furthermore, the Government has mandated that all Local Planning Authorities must update their respective LDSs within 12 weeks of the publication of the updated National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) (i.e. the new LDS must be published by 6<sup>th</sup> March 2025). Therefore, a new LDS has been produced for Cabinet approval.

In terms of audience, the LDS will be published on the Council's website where it will be available for residents and any other interested parties to view.

### **Summary of Impact and Issues**

As stated above, the Council has a statutory duty to keep an up to date version of the LDS available that can be readily viewed by the public. It must therefore be published on the SCC website.

As the LDS will be publicly accessible it has been prepared to ensure it is clear, concise, written in 'plain English' and compliant with the Council's corporate style guide. This will ensure it is accessible to a wide range of audiences.

## **Potential Positive Impacts**

The LDS will help residents and other interested parties in understanding the timeline in which the Council will look to progress its Local Plan. It will help these groups to identify the opportunities where they can engage in consultation on the Local Plan.

The LDS has been prepared in a style that is clear and accessible for a variety of audiences. It is hoped this will help residents and other interest parties to better understand the role of the LDS and interpret its content as intended.
